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**THE ELGEYO/MARAKWET COUNTY FINANCE BILL, 2018**

**AN ACT of the County Assembly of Elgeyo/Marakwet to provide for revenue-raising measures relating to County taxes, licenses, fees and charges for the County Government of Elgeyo/Marakwet for the year 2018/2019, and for matters incidental thereto and for connected purposes**

**ENACTED** by the County Assembly of Elgeyo / Marakwet as follows—

**PART I—PRELIMINARY****Short title and Commencement**

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Elgeyo/Marakwet County Finance Act, 2018 and shall, subject to section 2(2), come into operation on such a date as the County Executive Committee Member for Finance may appoint and different dates may be appointed for different provisions.

(2) The respective taxes, fees and charges, together with the rates applicable shall take effect in not later than three months after the commencement of this Act.

**Interpretation**

2. (1) The taxes, fees and charges set out in the Schedule shall apply for the respective services and at the rates set out therein.

(2) For greater certainty, the taxes, fees and charges applicable at the commencement of this Act shall continue to apply under the existing by-laws of the defunct Councils of Elgeyo/Marakwet until such by-laws are repealed and replaced by county legislation.

(3) For purposes of Iten Township, the rates, fees and charges payable under section 2 shall be applicable to all business being operated within a radius of three (3) kilometers from the central business district.

**PART II— FEES AND TAXES PAYABLE AND RATES APPLICABLE****Property Rates**

3. (1) Property Tax for the year 2018-2019

This tax shall apply to properties of all categories of owners liable to tax, for the assessment year 2018-2019, the rates of property tax have been specified in PART III First Schedule of the Act.

- (i) These taxes shall be as laid down in the valuation roll currently in force and shall transition from time to time to the new valuation roll as shall come into force from time to time for purposes of computation of tax due.
- (ii) Tax authority to levy this tax is derived from Article 209(3) (a) of the constitution, the Rating Act cap 267, the valuation for Rating Act cap 266 laws of Kenya and the provisions of the relevant county legislations as shall be enacted by the County Assembly from time to time.

(2) Penalties on outstanding Property Tax rates —

A 2% Penalty shall be levied in respect of property liable to tax for the assessment year 2018-2019 in the following cases —

- (i) in case of property other than national government property having total outstanding rates at the turn of the calendar year the amount of property tax computed shall be increased by a penalty calculated at 2% simple interest (as per amendment of Section 16 Cap 267 of Rating Act in the 2012 Finance Act); or
- (ii) in case of national government owned properties, the property tax computed in terms of contribution in lieu of rates outstanding shall be increased by a penalty at 2% simple interest per annum for purposes of such property tax.

(3) Marginal Relief—

- (i) marginal relief shall be allowed in cases where the amount is cleared by the turn of the year to ensure that annual amount of the property tax payable does not accrue penalties until 31st of March in each calendar year;
- (ii) in case of every property with a registered title deed/ certificate of lease the total property tax under this section (herein after referred to as property tax) and where such properties having been registered for more than two years preceding the year of notification, marginal relief shall be provided to exclude any charges for the period beyond seven years.

**Other fees and charges for services**

4. The revenue raising measures of the county government relating to fees and charges for services are set out in the Schedule.

**No Prejudice to National Economic Policies**

5. This section provides that the County revenue raising measures shall comply with Article 209(5) of the constitution which provides that the measure do not prejudice—

- (a) national economic policies
- (b) economic activities across County boundaries
- (c) the national mobility of goods, services, capital or labour.

In respect to the power of the County to impose taxes and other revenue raising measure it is proposed that the mobility of goods from other Counties be accompanied by movement permits to augment Article 209(5) of the 2010 Constitution.

**Persons with disabilities**

6. Persons with Disabilities in possession of a certificate of disability, shall pay forty percent (40%) of the respective taxes, fees and charges as provided for in this Act.

**PART III—PAYMENT****Payment to the County**

7. (1) Any payment to the County shall be made to an officer appointed by the County to collect revenue or through any other mode of payment as may be prescribed by the County Executive Committee Member.

(2) An officer appointed by the County to collect revenue shall have identification card issued by the County which shall be pinned or tagged where it can be easily identified by any person.

(3) A County official receipt shall be issued for all payments made to the County.

(4) A person shall not receive or collect any money on behalf of the County unless he or she has been appointed to do so or has authority as the receiver and collector of the County revenue.

(5) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.

**PART IV—OFFENCES AND PENALTIES****General penalty**

8. (1) Any person who commits an offence under this Act for which no penalty is provided shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings two hundred thousand or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or both.

(2) To maximise revenue collection, use of other arms of the National Government shall be applied during enforcement.

(3) Any impounded item not claimed shall be auctioned after three months from the date of impoundment unless otherwise specified.

**Offences by staff of the County**

9. A member of staff of the County or any other person having duty to perform under this Act who—

- (a) makes, in any record, or document required to be kept or made by that person, an entry which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe not to be true or to be false;
- (b) wilfully refuses to do anything which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to know is required to be done;
- (c) interferes with any other person or process under this Act, so as to defeat the provisions or requirements of this Act;
- (d) where required under this Act to do anything to give effect to the provisions of this Act, fails to do that thing;
- (e) without reasonable cause omits to do something in breach of his or her duty under this Act;
- (f) wilfully contravenes the provision of this Act to give undue advantage or favour to another person; or
- (g) fails to prevent or report to the County or any other relevant authority, the commission of an offence committed under this Act.

Commits an offence and is liable on conviction, to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings two hundred thousand or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or both.

**PART V—AMENDMENTS TO THE SCHEDULE****Amendments to the schedule**

**10.** (1) The Executive Committee Member responsible for finance may forward to the County Assembly a legislation proposal entailing amendments of the schedules for considerations.

(2) Any proposed legislation made under subsection (1) shall be laid before the County Assembly without unreasonable delay, and unless a resolution approving the proposed legislation is passed by the County Assembly within twenty one days when the Assembly next sits after the proposed legislation is so laid, the proposed legislation shall lapse.

**PART VI—MISCELLANEOUS****Application of transitional provision**

**11.** This section adopts the provisions of the transition clauses in sixth schedule of the Constitution sections 6 and 33 as regards existing laws and institutions that were in force immediately before the counties as relates to the various taxes, licenses and other charges or fees to be construed to continue being in force for the purposes of this Act; and the taxes, licenses and other charges chargeable under this Act by virtue of the said legislations shall automatically transition and be deemed to be charges under the various relevant County legislations as shall from time to time be enacted by the county Assembly.

**Fees and charges authorized by contracts etc.**

**12.** This section mandates the County Government pursuant to section 6 of the County Government Act to enter into contracts and agreements providing for the payment of services provided under them.

**Commission on Revenue**

**13.** Revenue collectors on commission to be paid 25% of the Revenue they collect.

**Revenue Administration**

**14.** Appropriation In Aid (AIA) of 5% of Total Revenue Collected on Quarterly basis be paid to Revenue Directorate for revenue administration.

**PART VII—GENERAL ANTI-EVASION MEASURES****Evasion in payment of County Revenue**

**15.** In the background of continued evasion in payment of County revenue it's accordingly proposed to provide general anti evasion rule in the Finance Act, 2018 to deal with loss of revenue.



The main features of such a regime are—

- (a) movement of goods across Counties will be subject to movement permits agreed among Counties;
- (b) automating collection point and processes for real time monitoring;
- (c) imposition of fine and penalties for mitigating tax evasion;
- (d) physical mapping of business premises within the County centres and markets;
- (e) standardization of agricultural produce package; and
- (f) all adverts should be paid for in advance before placement pursuant to the Physical Planning Act; and
- (g) use of mobile money cash transfer, bank Agent, direct banking.
