Five points Agenda for Kisumu City

My government, The Kisumu city management board, senior members of business community within the city and Kisumu Lakefront Development Corporation Board members have identified five key focus areas and quick win projects targeted to be implemented within a year to improve the city Economy and the services offered to the citizenry. These include but not limited to:

1. Drainage

Flooding within the city has been perennial problem and to avert this, the city management is in the process of implementing city drainage master plan as a matter of urgency by unclogging and expanding the drainage systems within the City to address this problem.

2. Integrated solid waste management system

City management has initiated a process to develop and implement a sustainable system for effective and efficient management and treatment of fresh solid waste generated within the city in consistent with the strategic objectives in the Kisumu Integrated Solid Waste Management Plan (KISWAMP). through establishment of Material Recovery Centres (MRF) within the wards and accelerate the waste evacuation and cleaning within the CBD and peri-urban areas so that the citizenry can live in a clean, safe, healthy and habitable environment.

3. Environmental conservation and stewardship

One of the mandates of the city is to protect, preserve, conserve and restore the Environment. In line with this mandate the City will be launching a tree planting programme, targeting to plant one million tree seedlings within one year, under the urban afforestation initiative. This will be executed in partnership with the likeminded Stakeholders, both public and private sector (including KIWASCO, East Africa Breweries Limited, KFS and other partners) to make Kisumu a green City along the Lake. This tree planting programme will be launched by the Governor in due course.

4. Street lighting and maintenance

One of the deliverables in the Governor's manifesto is to make Kisumu City a twenty four-hour Economy. In cognizant of this, City management has put in place intensive and elaborate measures through installation and maintenance of solar lights in the urban and peri-urban areas where there is no lighting to ensure that City is well lit to achieve the twenty four-hour economy.

5. Public Health and sanitation

For any meaningful development to be realized in any civilized City and urban areas, there must be order on all the aspect of social economic, Cultural and Religious activities. City management has initiated a consultative process of making By-laws to ensure that the Burial in some sections within the city is prohibited and the provisions of the public health Acts are a followed to the latter.

Under the above strategic areas, the City Management is engaging with various stakeholders, mainly from the private sector to join hands under Public-Private Partnership, in a comprehensive initiative to enhance urban aesthetics through beautification of roundabouts, gardens, parks and open spaces, urban afforestation and streetscaping

Statement From the City Manager, Kisumu City.

The City Business Community have desiged a non motorised promenade for Jaramogi Oginga Odinga Triangle. The roads surrounding the triangle will be one way with palm and Ashock trees in the middle.

We plan to divert all busses and big tracks to use the bypass and avoid Nairobi Road through kisumu Boys Round about.

We plan to relocate all buses with their offices and parking yards within the CBD to otonglo and Nyamasaria.

We have formed Kisumu Stakeholders Committee with mandate to beautify the City. We meet every Wednesday to plan and strategize on 7 strategic interventions. We held two joint meetings and composed the following Technical Working Groups (TWGs). The Technical Groups are;

- 1. Beautification and Greening of the City Parks and Roundabouts.
- 2. Cleaning of the City and waste management
- 3. Drainage openings and improve sewage system
- 4 Streetlighting and park lights.
- 5. Environmental conservation with aggressive tree planting with a target of 10 million trees in the next 3 years.
- 6. Sustainable city transport.
- 7. Design of Dunga Waterfront and a Marina. This will complement the planned survey by Kisumu Lakefront Development Cooperation. 

To provide much needed shade on glaring hot roads for pedestrians;


To reduce the impact of noise pollution caused due to increase in number of vehicular traffic;


